

# PREA Annual Report 2018

## GENERAL INFORMATION

During 2018, there were a total of 415 new residential youth\* which was a decrease from 446 in 2017. Of the new admissions in 2018, 123 were female and 291 were male. The average daily residential population was 265 clients, an increase from 260 clients in 2017. Adelphoi Village became compliant with the PREA regulations on July 18, 2014. The agency continues to revise and implement all aspects of the PREA regulations.

## AUDITS CONDUCTED

During 2018, five PREA re-audits were completed for four Adelphoi Village units. The result of the audit were 12 standards exceeding the regulations, 203 standards met and 0 standards not met.

## REVIEW

Adelphoi Village continues to implement all PREA regulations in coordination with best practices to address allegations of sexual abuse and sexual harassment. Leadership is devoted to ensuring and monitoring the compliance for residents and staff. The following are corrective actions completed during this reporting period include re-educate staff on clients' access to outside emotional support, formalize the retaliation monitoring across all units, standardize notification of clients of the findings of investigations, ensure documentation of client education is being completed and verify cross gender postings are located in the proper locations within the unit.

## DATA

All allegations of sexual abuse and harassment are reported to ChildLine, PA State Police (or local Police depending on the unit location) or both agencies depending on the allegation. Adelphoi Village reviews and conducts sexual abuse incident reviews for all reported sexual abuse and harassment investigations. The team is a multidisciplinary team with members of upper management in clinical, administrative, facilities, human resources and medical departments.

The agency leadership continues to ensure staff have the proper training and support to adjust and handle this changing environment.
